the hub develops and delivers social inclusion projects that make a difference in our local communities.

Currently these include:

Rent Deposit Guarantee Scheme which assists people on low incomes who are in housing need access private sector tenancies across Dumfries and Galloway.

Weekly Private Sector Information Service which provides up to date information on available private sector tenancies in Dumfries and Galloway to assist people in housing need.

Winter Warmth for Older People which provides a free logs and kindling service for older people in Dumfries and Galloway who use open fires and who experience fuel poverty.

Getting Connected which assists people apply online for benefits, create CV's, job searches and apply for jobs as well as providing learning sessions on using computers.

Community Defibrillator Project which provides defibrillator units and training for local communities in rural areas at some distance from emergency services.

Social Prescribing Project which assists people through facilitating access to local support networks to improve their health and wellbeing.
