Sustrans – Network Action Grant Fund

This scheme is funded by Transport Scotland and delivered by Sustrans Scotland, seeks to empower communities in implementing improvements which make journeys on the National Cycle Network more attractive and enjoyable. Funding is available for projects which benefit people or wildlife across National Cycle Network routes in Scotland. Examples of costs which can be covered with a Network Action grant award include litter-picking equipment, tools, seeds, bird and bat boxes, habitat management training, wildlife surveying equipment and training to lead walks or rides on the Network. **Deadline: 17th May 2019 Max Grant: £750** Link: <https://www.sustrans.org.uk/scotland/national-cyclenetwork/network-action-grant-funding>

BBC Children in Need – Main Grants

This scheme awards grants each year to organisations supporting disadvantaged children and young people in the UK. They give grants for children and young people of 18 years and under experiencing disadvantage through: illness, distress, abuse or neglect; any kind of disability; behavioural or psychological difficulties; living in poverty or situations of deprivation. Projects funded will make differences in children's lives that help prevent or overcome the effects of the disadvantages they face. Projects achieve these differences by either working directly with children or seeking to improve their social and physical environments.

Thomas Wall Trust This scheme funds small charities (under £100,000 p.a.) running specific projects that address the educational and social needs of their communities. Foundation Scotland – Scotch Whisky Action Fund This scheme will support and develop a range of projects/ initiatives which deliver targeted interventions designed to tackle alcohol-related harms across three themes: young people (aged under 18); families; communities. Research commissioned by the Scotch Whisky Association suggests that there are gaps in provision across each of these themes and that the range of interventions and good practice are not fully developed.
